1. A minute's silence for departed lifesavers

1.1 A minute of silence was observed for lifesavers who departed in the past year.

2. Minutes of the last AGM held on 21 March 2018

2.1 The minutes of the last AGM were confirmed after a motion by Mr Thong Ann Edward was seconded by Mr. Mohamed Ayub without any objections.

3. Adoption of the Annual Report for the year ending 31 December 2018

- 3.1 Hon. Assistant Secretary highlighted the main activities of 2018.
- 3.2 Mr. Philip Ng referred to membership sub-committee (overseeing examiner matters) and urged for more upgrade and appointment of new examiners. Patrick Lee endorsed Philip Ng's comments.

3.3 On a motion by Mr. Liang Yaowen, and seconded by Mr. Jeremy Peh, the Annual Report for the year ending 31 December 2018 was approved and adopted with no objections.

4. Adoption of the Financial Report for the year ending 31 December 2018

- 4.1 The 2018 Financial Report was presented and the Hon. Treasurer covered the main points including a surplus of \$12,890.
- 4.2 Mr. Patrick Lee asked about the society's sustainability and Hon. Treasurer responded that expenses are regularly monitored and controlled.
- 4.3 In response to Mr. Liang Yaowen's and Mr. Philip Ng's comments on setting a time frame for SLSS cheques to be banked in, Hon. Treasurer agreed to review whether SLSS should have it shorter than 6 months currently.
- 4.4 Mr. Philip Ng asked about details of bad debts and AEDs in store (details that Hon. Treasurer did not have on hand) but there were no objections to the Hon. Treasurer sending the details to members after the AGM.
- 4.5 On a motion by Mr. Patrick Lee and seconded by Mr. Chia Ser Kian , the 2018 Financial Report was approved and adopted with no objections.

5. Adoption of the change of the audit partner from Chiew Mong to Wong Xiao Wei in SLSS Auditors Odds & Even Associates.

5.1 On a motion by Mr. Liang Yaowen and seconded by Mr. Tang Yong Chong the change of audit partner from Chiew Mong to Wong Xiao Wei in SLSS Auditors Odds & Even Associates was approved and adopted with no objections.

7. To consider the additional amendments to the changes to the Constitution approved by the Extra Ordinary General Meeting (held on 17 November 2016) suggested by Sport SG attached (see Annex A1) and where approved, to adopt such proposed amendments subject to the approval of the relevant authorities

3. Governance & Conflict of Interest Policies etc.

The Exco oversees the affairs of SLSS and is responsible for strategic plans, key initiatives, fund raising, investment decisions, financial performance reviews and corporate governance policies. The Exco meets regularly in most months. It is supported in its role by the staff, committees, units and other SLSS officials. Exco members must place SLSS' interest over those of their own and of their organisation and are expected to avoid actual and perceived conflicts of interest. Where Exco members have personal interest in business transactions or contracts, they are expected to declare such interests as soon as possible and abstain from discussion and decision-making on the matter. Where such conflicts exist, the Exco will evaluate whether any potential conflicts of interest will affect the continuing independence of that Exco members are also not paid any remuneration for their board services although Exco members qualified as lifesaving trainers or examiners or in other areas are sometimes engaged to work at the usual honorarium or fee.

SLSS is registered as a charity and approved as an Institution of a Public Character. Although it is not mandatory, the SLSS follows the guidelines of the Code of Governance for Charities & Institutions of a Public Character as far as they are relevant and applicable.

4. A description of the governing instrument of SLSS

The governing instrument of the SLSS is the Constitution of the Singapore Life Saving Society and available on the SLSS website.





Treasurer's Report (Lee Lingen)

There was a deficit of \$49,236.00 and this was mainly due to the following:

- (1) Reduction of booking and courses fees by \$36,910
- (2) Loss of rental subsidy \$15,827
- (3) Loss of income from Lifesaving instructor and teacher course

The reserves that we have set aside provide financial stability and the means for the continuance and development of our activities. We intend to maintain our reserves at a level which is at least equivalent to 3 years of annual operating expenditure so that we have the necessary buffer to ensure a relatively smooth transition if it becomes necessary. We intend to use the reserves in the following manner in (at the appropriate time):

- a. as a buffer in financially challenging years
- b. to fund developments and new initiatives
- c. to fund purchases of a property and rescue and other equipment.

The Executive Committee reviews at least on an annual basis the amount of reserves that are required to ensure that they are adequate.
